### **VISION**

During his Enthronement as Pope one year ago, Pope Benedict XVI proclaimed in homily, "The purpose of our lives is to reveal God to men. And only where God is seen does life truly begin. Only when we meet the living God in Christ do we know what life is. We are not some casual and meaningless product of evolution. Each of us is the result of a thought of God. Each of us is willed, each of us is loved, each of us is necessary. There is nothing more beautiful than to be surprised by the Gospel, by the encounter with Christ. There is nothing more beautiful than to know Him and to speak to others of our friendship with Him."

This is our purpose, the purpose of our lives; and for this to be realized fully, we have been regenerated and incorporated in the mystical body of Jesus Christ, the Catholic Church. This is the milieu of our participation in the Life of the Trinity; and this is concretely realized day by day, Sunday by Sunday in our parish churches. In the Catechism of the Catholic Church, we read (1198): "In its earthly state the Church needs places where the community can gather together. Our visible churches, holy places, are images of the holy city, the heavenly Jerusalem, toward which we are making our way on pilgrimage. It is in these churches that the Church celebrates public worship to the glory of the Holy Trinity, hears the word of God and sings his praise, lifts up her prayer, and offers the sacrifice of Christ sacramentally present in the midst of the assembly. A Church must also be a space that invites us to the recollection and silent prayer that extend and internalize the great prayer of the Eucharist.

"Finally, the church has an eschatological significance. To enter into the house of God, we must cross a threshold, which symbolizes passing from the world wounded by sin to the world of the new Life to which all men are called. The visible church is a symbol of the Father's house toward which the People of God is journeying and where the father 'will wipe away every tear from their eyes.' Also, for this reason, the Church is the house of *all* God's children, open and welcoming." (1186).
