EASTER SUNDAY

My Dear People,

CHRIST IS RISEN! INDEED, HE IS RISEN! ALLELUIA!

Easter Sunday is the greatest of Sundays, the Sunday of Sundays, because it is about the core truth of our Christian faith—the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead.

If we devalue or minimize the truth of Easter into just a metaphor or symbol for the annual rebirth of nature, we miss the point and thus miss its power. Easter is not about some version of eternal return. If the flowers and birds of nature return each year, so do the wars and violence of history. Easter is all about something much more startling and wondrous. On a particular day, the “Third Day”, Jesus Christ rose bodily from the dead. He was no longer subject to the laws of biology and physics. He rose from the dead with an entirely new, risen life! And now he still goes about, as St. Peter says in today’s first reading, “Doing good and healing all those oppressed by the devil.”

Moreover, today we are celebrating not only the resurrection of Jesus Christ two thousand years ago in Jerusalem, but also the access we all now have, as baptized Christians, to the risen Lord today in New Orleans. Like Jerusalem on that first Easter, tomorrow morning the world will go on with its mundane business. But embedded all over the world are people who are living and will continue to live a deeper truth than this world knows. They have died and risen to new life in baptism. They have been “Christened” or made a constitutive part of His mission of salvation. In our city, state, nation and, indeed, world, where so many people are looking for the way, searching

for the truth, and yearning for a meaningful life, we have Jesus Christ who is the way, the truth and the life for everyone!


The resurrection of our Lord shows us that salvation is not a dream but a concrete reality, it teaches us that beyond darkness there is light, beyond death there is life, and beyond sin there is forgiveness. Maybe over the months and years our Christian discipleship has become lukewarm, blurred and compromised, Easter is the time for renewal. It is a time to recommit ourselves to Christ and to His Church. Easter is a time to refresh our Catholic faith.

When we affirm and experience the whole truth of Easter in the sacramental journey of the Church, things change. It changes how we face living and even how we face dying. It gives us new hope and new life. Now, because of Easter, the risen Christ is still “Going about doing good and healing all those oppressed by the devil.” Because we are Christians, we are an important part of that crucial, ongoing and glorious mission.

Christ is Risen! Alleluia!
